YEAR IN REVIEW

Because of the pandemic and elated restrictions, the 2020–2021 season will long be remembered as most unusual, with only one live production being performed. After sixteen months of rehearsing and preparing, director Alta Moseley and a highly talented cast were finally able to present *The Odd Couple, Female Version* in April, 2021. From the opening of the red curtain on opening night to the closing at the last performance, patrons filled the house with laughter as our community celebrated the opportunity to gather again for a live performance on the John Kollock Stage.

Though HCT was only able to produce one production, it was not a season without several other important distinctions. In December, HCT participated in the downtown Clarkesville Christmas parade with a fan favorite float featuring *The Grinch*, played by board member Rufino Pato. Complimenting the downtown holiday spirit was HCT's magical and award-winning window display, crafted by board members Mary Decker and Chris Bryant, featuring memorabilia from past HCT shows. Also in December, Lynne Warren directed HCT's first online production, *Christmas at HCT*, with a variety of musical and theatrical performances filmed and produced by Randy Warren and made available to HCT patrons via YouTube.

With the turning of the calendar, the new year brought some sad news with the passing of John Preece, HCT's Vice President of Productions. A former professional actor and director, John made significant contributions as a director and mentor to many HCT volunteers, and his life was celebrated with a special memorial service at HCT in June.

In March, HCT leadership applied for a Rural Business Development Grant (RBDG) through the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) for the purposes of completing a dressing room renovation project. The grant application included multiple letters of support from local business owners in our community who were able to articulate how a downtown venue for live entertainment brings value to every local business by attracting patrons to the downtown Clarkesville square. As a result, the USDA awarded a grant of \$65,700 for the purpose executing a full renovation of the HCT dressing room. The construction project is set to begin in November, 2021.

In May, HCT awarded Stephen Grizzard Memorial scholarships to two deserving individuals, Jadon Williams and Matthew Jackson, with a \$500 college scholarship each.

While many non-profits struggled through the pandemic, HCT distinguished itself as a resilient organization navigating over sixteen months with no live productions, which is our primary source of revenue. HCT not only survived these difficult days but thrived with a keen focus on our mission. Financially, HCT stands strong because of countless volunteers, numerous unsolicited donations throughout the season, and a history of fiscal responsibility leading into the pandemic. The story of HCT is one marked by a community of dedicated individuals who believe the arts have a special place in our community, enriching lives and making a meaningful impact on volunteers and patrons. The lights might have dimmed this past year, with limited opportunities to welcome patrons, but the spirit and mission of HCT remained as vibrant as ever before.

UPCOMING 2021-2022 PRODUCTIONS



This is the story of Edward Bloom, a traveling salesman who lives life to its fullest! Edward's incredible, larger-than-life stories thrill everyone around him—most of all, his devoted wife Sandra. But their son, Will, about to have a child of his own, is determined to find the truth behind his father's epic tales. Overflowing with heart and humor, *Big Fish* is an extraordinary musical that reminds us why we love going to the theater—for an experience that's richer, funnier, and bigger than life itself.



A Christmas Carol is a fresh approach to the classic tale that faithfully conveys the magic of Dickens. On Christmas Eve in 1843, friends and family gathered at Dickens' home ask him to tell a story, but he refuses to work on Christmas Eve. If there is going to be a story, each must take part in its telling. And so the story unfolds with the ensemble cast playing over forty parts.



Flaming Idiots is a contemporary farce featuring Carl and Phil, who decide that the ladder to success is missing a few rungs. They know that big money is waiting for people with an entrepreneurial spirit and sound business judgment. They have lots of the spirit but little of the judgement, and their new gourmet health food restaurant flounders. A competitor has been crowded ever since a notorious mobster was shot there over twenty years ago. What if someone could get murdered in their restaurant?



The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe faithfully recreates the magic and mystery of Aslan, the great lion, his struggle with the White Witch, and the adventures of four children who inadvertently wander from an old wardrobe into the exciting, never-to-be-forgotten Narnia. The intense action features chases, duels, and escapes as the witch is determined to keep Narnia in her possession and to end the reign of Aslan. This story of love, faith, courage, and giving, and a true celebration of life.



It's a day in the life of Charlie Brown! You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown really is just that, a day made up of little moments picked from all the days of Charlie Brown, from Valentine's Day to the baseball season, from wild optimism to utter despair, all mixed in with the lives of his friends (both human and non-human) and strung together on the string of a single day, from bright uncertain morning to hopeful starlit evening.



The Drowsy Chaperone is a loving send-up of the Jazz Age musical. With the houselights down, a man in a chair appears on stage and puts on his favorite record: the cast recording of a fictitious 1928 musical. The recording comes to life, with two lovers on the eve of their wedding, a bumbling best man, a desperate theatre producer, a not-so-bright hostess, two gangsters posing as pastry chefs, a misguided Don Juan, and an intoxicated chaperone. This is the stuff of legends.
