YEAR IN REVIEW

The 2022-2023 season at Habersham Community Theater featured spectacular lineup of diverse and exciting shows that captivated and entertained audiences of all ages.

HCT kicked off the year by hosting one of our volunteers, Carson Sprinkle of CLS Films, as he presented a short film entitled, "Mirror Madness." The audience was delighted to see many familiar faces of our volunteers in this independent film production. Our main stage season opened in October, 2022, with *The Addams Family*, directed by LeAnne Challenger and Lynne Warren. Audiences were enchanted by the kooky and mysterious world of the Addams family as they followed Gomez, Morticia, Wednesday, and the rest of the quirky clan in their quest to navigate love, family, and all things macabre in this darkly delightful musical comedy. In keeping with the delightfully creepy spirit of this show, we participated in the City of Clarkesville's annual trick-or-treating on the square on Halloween night. We were also honored to host Maggie Smagur as she directed an operatta, *Riders to the Sea*, as her capstone project for her Bachelor of Arts in Arts Administration degree at Piedmont University.

The Christmas season kicked off with our annual showing of the ever-popular and iconic movie, "National Lampoon's Christmas Vacation." The following week, we presented *It's A Wonderful Life: A Live Radio Play*, directed by Chris Bryant and Mary Decker. Audiences took a nostalgic journey back to Bedford Falls with this heartwarming adaptation of the classic holiday film and experienced the magic of George Bailey's life and the impact he has on those around him. The

holiday season concluded with *The Sounds of Midnight: Counting Down a Century of Musical Theatre*, directed by Lisa Smith and presented on December 31, 2022, as a New Year's Eve concert celebration and fundraiser.

HCT started the new year with our presentation of *The Curious Savage*, directed by Susan Watson. Audiences were delighted with the whimsical and heartwarming story of Mrs. Ethel Savage, who found herself in the midst of a delightful comedy of errors as her stepchildren attempted to declare her insane. This play explored themes of family, love, and the true meaning of sanity.

With the advent of Spring, audiences were thrilled to embark on a magical adventure to the enchanting land of Narnia in *Prince Caspian*, directed by Lisa Smith in April. In this thrilling and fantastical stage adaptation of C.S. Lewis' epic story of war, Prince Caspian and the Pevensie siblings battle evil forces and strive to restore peace to the kingdom.

The end of the school season in June brought the production of *Almost, Maine*, directed by Chris Parker, Lisa Smith, and Susan Watson. Love was in the frosty air in the fictional town of Almost, Maine as this heartwarming and whimsical play explored the intricacies of love through a series of interconnected vignettes, each capturing a different facet of the human experience.

Our season rounded out in July with a partnership with Habersham Central High School as audiences kicked off their Sunday shoes and enjoyed the electrifying beats of *Footloose*, directed by Amber Miller and Susan Watson. Town newcomer Ren McCormack brought music, dance, and rebellious energy to a small town where dancing is forbidden. This high-energy musical was a celebration of freedom, self-expression, and the power of dance. During pre-production of this show, our cast participated in a flash mob at the City of Clarkesville's "Red, White, and Tunes" event at Pitts Park, where our performers surprised the audience with an energetic rendition and dance of the title song, "Footloose." This fabulous show concluded with a Habersham Community Theater first: the onstage real-life engagement of two of our performers, Julianna Ward and Austin Weyrich! We were thrilled to be part of such a special day for these talented cast members!

We are confident that the season's lineup left our audiences laughing, crying, and tapping their feet in delight. Along with the Board of Directors, I would like to thank all board members, members, directors, cast members, production and operation crews, and all other volunteers for their dedication, support, and hard work to make this season a success. 
ELF – November 30, December 1-3, 7-10, 2023
