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|  | <p>HELLO, DOLLY! – September 24-28, October 1-5, 2025</p> <p>Set in the 1890s, Hello, Dolly! is a vibrant and comedic musical that follows the story of Dolly Gallagher Levi, a bold and charismatic matchmaker in New York City. Widowed but full of life, Dolly is hired to find a wife for the wealthy but grumpy half-a-millionaire Horace Vandergelder of Yonkers. However, she has plans of her own—Dolly sets her sights on marrying Horace herself. As she schemes to win him over, Dolly also helps several young couples find love, including Horace's niece Ermengarde and her struggling artist boyfriend Ambrose, as well as Horace's overworked clerks Cornelius and Barnaby, who embark on a misadventurous trip to New York in search of romance and excitement.</p> |

Desperate to outdo the wildly successful William Shakespeare, Nick consults a soothsayer who predicts that musicals will be the future of theater. The brothers decide to write the first-ever musical, but their plan backfires as they encounter chaos, misunderstandings, and rivalry with Shakespeare. As the show progresses, the Bottoms navigate their relationship, the complexities of artistic success, and the joy of creativity. |  | <p>ROPE – April 9-12, 16-19, 2026</p> <p>Rope is a gripping stage thriller written by Patrick Hamilton that delves into the chilling psychology of murder and moral superiority. Set in a London flat in the 1920s, the play opens with two egotistical young men who kill just for the thrill of it and then host a dinner party with the body hidden in plain sight. As the evening unfolds, their arrogance and tension mount, especially under the watchful eye of their former mentor. Rope is a masterclass in psychological suspense. In 1948, Alfred Hitchcock directed the movie based on the story. It is not just a murder mystery—it's a chilling exploration of morality, intellect, and the danger of playing God. RATED PG-13</p> |
|  | <p>JAMES & THE GIANT PEACH – June 3-7, 10-14, 2026</p> <p>When James is sent by his conniving aunts to chop down their old fruit tree, he discovers a magic potion that results in a tremendous peach... and launches a journey of enormous proportions. Suddenly, James finds himself in the center of the gigantic peach, among human-sized insects with equally oversized personalities, but after it falls from the tree and rolls into the ocean, the group faces hunger, sharks and plenty of disagreements. Thanks to James' quick wit and creative thinking, the residents learn to live and work together as a family. |  | <p>SENSE & SENSIBILITY – July 30- August 2, 6-9, 2026</p> <p>Set in late 18th-century England, the Dashwood sisters Elinor and Marianne face fortune and misfortune after their father's sudden death leaves them destitute and vulnerable. Kate Hamill's adaptation of Jane Austen's "Sense and Sensibility" is a playful and exciting new take on the classic story originated by Jane Austen. When reputation is everything, how do you follow your heart? Hamill's play is full of humor, family, and romance that connects with all audiences across centuries.</p> |
